WHAT IS NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH? Our Neighborhood Watch Program was established by the Morris Township Police Department in 1982. Citizens in a Neighborhood Watch group are organized and work together to make their neighborhood safer from criminal activity. Citizens in a Neighborhood Watch group...

1. Learn how to improve your home security and how to “target harden” valuables.
2. Learn what “unusual activity” is, and how to report it to the Police.
3. Become informed “eyes and ears” of the Police Department.
4. Receive crime alerts; information you may not read in the newspapers.

Citizens work with the Police to prevent crimes and together to improve the quality of life in the Township of Morris. Crime tips provide valuable leads to apprehend criminals.
