The Township of Morris is soliciting quotations through a fair and open process for the services of a New Jersey State Department of Community Affairs Licensed Private On-Site Fire Agency for Third Party Fire Subcode Inspection Services. Sealed proposals will be received by the Bid Committee of the Township of Morris, County of Morris, State of New Jersey on September 1, 2010 at 10 AM prevailing time at the Municipal Building, Public Meeting Room/Courtroom, 50 Woodland Avenue, Convent Station, New Jersey.

Specifications may be obtained at the Purchasing Department/Administrator's Office, Municipal Building, 50 Woodland Avenue, Convent Station, New Jersey, during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM.

Proposals must be submitted on the proposal form furnished by the Township of Morris in the manner designated therein and required by the Specifications. Proposals must be enclosed in a sealed envelope bearing the name and address of the bidder, marked to the attention of the Purchasing Department, Third Party Fire Subcode Inspection Services Proposal. Proposals shall be delivered to the Purchasing Agent either in person at the hour designated or previous thereto by delivery or mail. No proposal shall be accepted after the designated time. The Township of Morris will not assume responsibility for proposals forwarded by mail or delivery service.

Vendors are required to comply with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 17:27.

Pursuant to P.L. 2004, c. 57 (N.J.S.A. 52:32-44) all business organizations that conduct business with a New Jersey government agency are required to be registered with the State of New Jersey. Vendors and their subcontractors must submit proof with their proposal that they are registered with the New Jersey Department of Treasury, Division of Revenue by submitting a copy of their Business Registration Certificate. Failure to provide the Business Registration Certificate with the proposal may be cause for rejection of the proposal as being nonresponsive.

The Township reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, if in its judgment the public interest will be best served by doing so.
